

Literacy

The children will be learning to:

Write lots of types of text – stories, lists, labels, non-fiction, poems, instructions and letters

Learn sounds and high frequency words

Explore writing, using sounds to write words.

Begin to do Big Write and make up their own stories based on toys

To use drama to create Toy World

Start to use VCOP- (Vocabulary- Conjunctions - Openers- Punctuation) to improve their writing.

Look closely at finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.

Start to explore exclamation marks and question marks

Begin to use their targets to improve their writing

Read in guided reading with an adult and discuss the book as part of a group including poetry

Learn a poem by heart

Physical Development

The children will be learning to:

Recognise the technical terminology in gym, such as - straddle, tuck and put these into practise in a routine.

Work with construction toys, play dough, pencils and pens to develop our fine motor skills

Geography, History and Science

The children will be learning to:

Understand about light and dark – using shadow puppets

Recognise different forces – make moving vehicles using axels

Recognise the features of Winter and the changing seasons

Say why a toy is old and order them into old, older, oldest.

Think about what features of the world would be and create Toy world, using varying construction, working as a team.

Make a map of Toy world.

Construct a lego / construction vehicle that moves.

Numeracy

The children will be learning to:

Count in ones, twos, fives and tens to one hundred

Recognise number bonds to 10 and 100

Read, write and order their numbers to 100

Find different ways to add and subtract a single digit number to or from a two digit number

Recognise two digit numbers are made of 10's and units/ones

Understand different positions when giving directions

Understand the difference between two numbers

Find halves and quarters of shapes and amounts

Personal Social and Emotional Development and RE

The children will be learning to:

Find out about Jesus and his friends

Understand what makes a good friend – respect one another – persevere when friendships get difficult

Cross the road safely

Art, music and D&T

The children will be learning to:

Use multimedia to create teddy bear pictures

Use clay to make teddy bears

Design and create their own puppet

Look at details on toys and create an observational drawing

Sing seasonal songs

Use instruments to explore pitch

The children will be learning to:

Use a mouse by drawing a teddy bear picture

Use iPads to explore algorithms

Use Beebots to explore algorithms
